ROTTERDAM UPCOMING HIGHLIGHTS



Nederlands Fotomuseum: Gallery of Honour of Dutch Photography

This photomuseum safeguards the Netherlands' current and future photographic heritage and makes it relevant to today's international context. On 21 January 2021, the Nederlands Fotomuseum in Rotterdam will open the *Gallery of Honour of Dutch Photography*, where 100 photographs will be on display. All the images have iconic value due to their social and artistic significance, and together they tell the story of photography in the Netherlands, from its beginnings to the present day (1841-2021)

Depot Boijmans Van Beuningen

Depot Boijmans Van Beuningen is the first art stoarage facility in the world that offers access to a museum's complete collection. The Depot has a different dynamic compared to the museum: there are no exhibitions, but you can browse amongst 151.000 artworks, alone or with a guide. In this way the visitor gets access to behind-the-scenes glimpses of – among other things – conservation and restoration. During the Golden Opening in fall 2021, its doors will permanently open.

Floating Office

The Global Centre on Adaptation (GCA) will move its new headquarter into the Floating Office Rotterdam (FOR). The project started in 2018 and is still ongoing. On the ground floor FENIX will house creative, culinary and cultural businesses. On the roof a spectacular viewpoint will offer a 360 degree view onto the Maas and Rotterdam.

ROTTERDAM CITY CENTRE

Rotterdam is a young, dynamic global city, continuously renewing itself at a rapid rate. Its city centre offers sparkling skyscrapers, an impressive port, renowned museums, trendy restaurants and food markets. The Rotterdam city centre has a lot of different neighbourhoods. On the following pages we selected the ones that are hotspots on their own and definitely worth the visit: Central District, Laurenskwartier, Maritime District, Witte de Withkwartier, Museumkwartier and West-Kruiskade.





Central District

Throngs of people come and go across the spacious, open square in front of Central Station. Visitors who stand still amidst the hustle and take a moment to look up will see a shield wall of impressive high-rise buildings: multinational corporations, international companies, hotels. The most prominent feature is the station itself, whose spectacular design has garnered quite a few architectural awards. The area behind all those masculine towers is an entirely different scene. In recent years, architects, designers and other pioneers have adopted the area as their testing arounds, bringing an unparalleled new energy to the dynamic area. It started with a vacant office building, Het Schieblock, which was transformed into a creative multi-tenant office building. There is a lush vegetable garden on the roof, the Dakakker: lunch is served here several days a week made from ingredients from the building's own rich harvest. The Luchtsingel Promenade offers pedestrians a route towards Hofbogen, including a surprising city view. The nightlife in Rotterdam Central city is edgy, adventurous and versatile. Get your feet of the ground at the BIRD jazz venue and nightclub or grab a beer and bratwurst at Biergarten: the options are endless.

Laurenskwartier

What began as a little river that flourished through Rotterdam, The Rotte, arew out to be the centre of a small fishing village when it was dammed in 1270. Trade and shipping emerged, leading to the rapid growth of 'Rotterdam'. The only remnant that still recalls that medieval village is the Late Gothic Laurenskerk. A striking feature beside the new architecture that has been added to Rotterdam since then! It offers a contrast with the covered Markthal, the latest and most visually prominent architectural icon in the area. Housed under a single horseshoe-shaped roof, 150 market stands, 15 shops, 8 restaurants and 228 apartments have been brought together by MVRDV architects. An outdoor market is also held here on Tuesdays and Saturdays. People come from all over to buy fresh produce and seafood here.

There's lots more to do in the Laurenskwartier, though: shopping on Meent and Pannenkoekstraat, catch an open-air concert on Grote Kerkplein, or taking a look in the famous Cube Houses designed by architect Piet Blom. Great food and drinks here, too, since the Laurenskwartier is a popular and versatile nightlife district. When the market stands are cleared away for the day, Binnenrotte's sidewalk cafés set out their terraces and the fun can continue until deep into the night.

Maritime District

Rotterdam's nautical roots are strong in the Maritime District. The Leuvehaven inner harbour was bustling with port activity a hundred years ago, but now it houses the oldest shipping museum in the Netherlands: the <u>Maritiem Museum</u>. Explore historic ships and cranes and experience how this spot gave birth to the world-class port of Rotterdam. Varying temporary exhibitions take you on a journey through the city's maritime past and present. Behind the Maritiem Museum, the monument known as '<u>The Destroyed City</u>' is worth checking out. This bronze statue by Ossip Zadkine represents a human figure with its heart missing: a symbol of Rotterdam, struck through the heart by the German bombardment in World War II. Younger visitors will love Kids Marina, a miniature port where you can drive your own firefighting vessel or police speedboat through the water!

Hungry? Thirsty? Head on to the <u>Oude Haven</u> waterfront, where gorgeous historic ships are tied up alongside friendly sidewalk cafés. If you'd like to see the truly massive ships sail into town, find yourself a seat at one of the quayside tables at <u>Prachtig</u>, a restaurant right on the riverbanks of the Mass, and enjoy the sight of the container ships, cruise liners and shimmering ripples on the river. Where are all those ships coming from? And what or who are they carrying? The sight is guaranteed to spark your imagination.

Witte de Withkwartier

The Witte de Withkwartier is the vibrant heart of the Rotterdam art scene and is known for its dynamic nightlife. Sometimes referred to as Rotterdam's 'Axis of Art', the Witte de Withstraat runs from <u>Museumpark</u> to the <u>Maritime Museum</u> and is lined in various cultural institutions. Browse the art on display at <u>TENT</u> or immerse yourself in avant-garde film and music in <u>WORM</u>.

While galleries, cultural institutes and fashion boutiques are open all day, the focus shifts to cafés and restaurants in the evening. Grand café <u>NRC</u> (which stands for Nieuw Rotterdams Café) is a great place to start your evening with a plate of spaghetti or fish&chips. Prefer a juicy hamburger? Join the patrons at <u>Ter Marsch</u>. The most famous pub in the street is <u>De Witte Aap</u>, an institution in the city's nightlife for ages; Lonely Planet even nominated it as the best bar in the world! More recent arrivals to the bar scene, like <u>Ballroom</u> and <u>La Bru</u>, are popular with the young and trendy crowd. The gin and tonics sell like hotcakes across the meticulously hip designer counters. Hoping to rub shoulders with local artists and authors? Head over to <u>De Schouw</u>, a classic café that's quickly packed on good nights.

Museumkwartier

Old Masters, modern art, contemporary design and whale skeletons: the museums surrounding Museumpark offer something to suit everyone's cultural preferences. Designed by famous architect Rem Koolhaas, the park holds many romantic nooks and lovely artworks. In summer, <u>Museumpark</u> frequently hosts small-scale festivals, street theatre, open-air cinema and markets. Rem Koolhaas also designed the <u>Kunsthal</u>, which is worth visiting for more than just the exceptional building. This institution – it's not a museum in the strictest sense of the word – presents a full spectrum of culture, displaying old art, new art, design & photography, from elitist to popular. <u>Depot Boijmans Van Beuningen</u>, that will open in 2021, has an impressive collection of masterpieces from the Early Middle Ages to the 21st century. <u>Het Nieuwe Instituut (The New Institute</u>) focuses on architecture, fashion, design and e-culture.

Several striking white villas stand along Museumpark, in the style of the Nieuwe Bouwen modernist school of architecture. One of them houses the <u>Chabot Museum</u>, while another is the <u>Sonneveld House</u> museum home, showing how hypermodern living could be in the 1930s. The <u>Natuurhistorisch Museum</u> is a hot tip for families with children. It has fossils, skeletons (including a huge whale), taxidermized animals, animals preserved in jars, and much more.

West Kruiskade

Shopping along the West-Kruiskade is like taking a trip around the world. Dim sum, swaying golden cats, Surinamese gilt, authentic Dutch meatballs, Afro wigs, Hindustani wedding gowns, exotic vegetables, Turkish baklava. The cultural *melting pot* is immediately apparent here, more palpable than anywhere else in Rotterdam. Food plays an important role. Feel free to follow your nose and discover delicious specialities in the multicultural eateries, and don't be shy about trying something new.

The West-Kruiskade is dominated by a cheerfully friendly street culture, where much of the day-to-day activity happens outdoors. The atmosphere is exuberant, with cyclists winding their way between the honking cars. The sidewalks are often clogged with locals pausing to chat as they go about their errands.

ROTTERDAM EAST LIVELY, UPCOMING AND HOME TO A LOT OF ROTTERDAMMERS

The main focus areas of this part of Rotterdam are Kralingen and Hoogkwartier. Kralingen is traditionally known as the chiquer side of Rotterdam, with its villa neighbourhoods and elegant lanes. The area is home to lots of students, since the Erasmus University Rotterdam is located here. *Oostzeedijk* boasts lots of pubs and restaurants where you can grab a meal for a reasonable price. The biggest park in Rotterdam, Kralingse Bos, can be found here. It is a green oasis accessible to anyone that would like to escape the city every now and then.

Hoogkwartier is upcoming and the place to be in Rotterdam. The Hoogstraat offers many places to eat, drink and shop. A crown jewel that reflects the rebuilding of Rotterdam is located here, *Het Industriegebouw* was proclaimed a national monument in 1991. The building opened in 1952 and was designed by the legendary architect Hugh Maaskant, in collaboration with Willem van Tijen. Many creatives in Rotterdam have opened a store, gallery, or coffee shop in this area. Often small in size but big in uniqueness.

Blue City

Blue City is an incubator for circular entrepreneurs, researchers and the government in and around Rotterdam. At this moment their hub (situated in a deserted swimming pool) and dynamic community serve as a breeding ground for more than 30 innovative, circular companies linking their waste-streams. In this way they create a much needed tangible and inspiring example for the circular economy and build the city and economy of the future. This year, Blue City celebrates its 5th anniversary.

The Slaak Rotterdam

Ten years ago this historic building from 1954 was declared a national monument. It is part of the heritage of rebuilding the city after its destruction in WWII. After having various functions, such as a pool center, an art gallery and being occupied by squatters, the Slaakhuys has been given a new purpose as a design boutique hotel The Slaak Rotterdam. It now includes 74 spacious rooms, restaurant and bar Didot34, two conference rooms and the Studio34 gym. The Slaak Rotterdam is located in the east of Rotterdam, a 15-minute walk from the Markthal and a metro station right on its doorstep.

And there is more! Bordering the Oude Noorden area, the Hofbogen archways under the former Hofplein station house dozens of creative entrepreneurs. Sip a world-class cup of coffee at Man met Bril, browse through boutiques and plunge into the nightlife as evening falls. BIRD club guarantees great parties and concerts and FG Food Lab is known as one of the best restaurants in Rotterdam. Don't forget to head up to the roof of the former Hofplein station, where you will find a city park and the Luchtsingel, to walk around in the open air.

A green city park has been realized on the roof of the former Hofplein Station. Here you can sit down for a picknick or walk through the greenery. In the coming years, the entire Hofbogen route will be transformed into a place where local residents can play, develop urban agriculture and meet each other. De Hofboog

Looking for an unusual bed and breakfast in Rotterdam? De Hofboog is the right address for you. Who doesn't want to sleep under a bridge? Or better said a railway viaduct. It is possible in the longest national monument of the Netherlands.

For years, this unpolished part of town primarily featured industrial uses. Where fruit and juice companies once stood, creative enterprise is now allowed to flourish. Following in the footsteps of artist Joep van Lieshout, designer Daan Roosegaarde also opened his 'dream factory' here.

Historic Delfshaven

Historic Delfshaven is a neighbourhood that survived the bombardment of Rotterdam in 1940. Delfshaven locals once earned their living by fishing for herring and distilling gin. The historic canal houses now hold cosy shops selling antiques and bric-a-brac, as well as lovely cafes and restaurants. Definitely stop by brewery De Pelarim, that was established in 1996, to try the 'liquid gold of Rotterdam'.

Clear Rivers

Clear Rivers is a proposal to retrieve plastic from the river Nieuwe Maas just before it reaches the North Sea and becomes part of the plastic soup. The plastics will be recycled into floating platforms and form a new green environment. These floating parks are a plus for the city of Rotterdam, but will also fulfil an ecological role in the river water. The building blocks are designs in such a way, that nature can grow on top and new life in the water will have its sole for existence as well. The bottom of the platform will have a rough finish where plants have enough surface to grow and fish have a place to leave their eggs.

Rijnhaven Bridge

The Rijnhavenbrug (2012) in Rotterdam is by Quist Wintermans Architects. The crane shaped bridge connects the busy Wilhelminapier with the popular Katendrecht neighborhood. Its shape and color reminds of the old cranes used in the former harbors. The Rijnhaven bridge is 160 meters long and widest at 11 meters. Furthermore, the bridge opens whereas the movable part is 27 meters long. Noteworthy are the benches and lanterns decorating the deck of the Rijnhavenbrug in Rotterdam. While sitting on one of the benches one can easily fall in love with the view through the gaze fence.

SS Rotterdam

The Steamship Rotterdam is the largest ocean-going steamer ever built in the Netherlands.
